God's Game of Telephone

You've probably played the game of "pass it on" before, maybe years
ago on the playground. It's a simple concept: one person whispers
something in another person's ear, and it gets repeated person by per-
son throughout the group, until finally the last one to hear the mes-
sage has to say it out loud. Whatever ends up being said at the end of
the game is usually a far cry from the original statement, and every-
one has a good laugh. As individuals, we don't receive news in the
same way. Our personalities, our histories, our weaknesses, and our
strengths determine how we interact with information we encounter
in the world, both good and bad. One person will interpret a compli-
ment positively; someone else will take offense. One person reacts to
news of a job promotion with joy, another is disappointed that now
they will have less time with their family. The same news can mean
completely different things to different people. But what God gives
us is the truth in love, and the truth in love is the same in every place
and in every time, for every person of every race. When Christ prayed
to the Father that "the love with which you loved me may be in
them," he was asking that the magnificent gift that had been imparted
to him would also be imparted to us. Our job is to play a game of pass
it on with this gift of love. How do we keep it from becoming
warped? Through remaining committed to the word of God, to the
sacraments, and to one another. In this game, we don't change the
message. The message changes us. And we have to give it away to
keep it.

(FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR WORKERS & VISITORS)



- † Flowers allowed from May 15—June 25
- † Winter decorations allowed from Dec 1– March 15
- † After these dates, only one (1) pot of flowers per lot
- † No artificial flowers
- † No urns, metal planters, flag holders, glass containers,
stones or vigil lights
- † No planting flowers, trees or shrubs/bushes in the earth
- † No pets allowed
- † Cemetery closes at dusk

(Hazards—glass breaking and falling in grass can become
a projectile object with the mowers. Artificial decorations
can get caught up in the blades of the mowers. Pots or
objects placed on the ground in front of the stones hinder
the crew from cleaning close to the stones while weed
whacking or mowing.)
